
How to use ZOOM Chat Feature

Accessing in-meeting chat

- 1. While **in** a **meeting**, tap the screen to make the controls appear.
- 2. Tap "More", and then tap "Chat".
- 3. You can type your **chat** message and click "Send" or if you want to change the recipient, click the arrow next to "Send to" and choose a different person or group of people.

Treasurer's Report



What is the Emergency Response Team with the acronym ERT? It is a team of SERT Club members who have received specialized training to help others, following an emergency. We are organized in a Command & Control structure, so when the team is activated its response will address as many of the needs of OHCC as we are trained to deliver.

Emergency Response Team



Emergency Response Team consists of SERT Members who are graduates of the FEMA CERT Academy or SERT Advanced Safety Skills & Preparedness Training.

SERT Members who have an assigned call sign of a "C"=Command, "L"=Leaders, "T"=Tactical, "A"=Affiliated, or "F"=First Aid are members of this team.

A current Red Cross Adult First Aid course and continued education are required. If you would like more information, please contact SERT at ohccsert@gmail.com.

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The ERT members are assigned a call sign that designates their level of training so they can easily be deployed to meet the needs of the community. We are always looking for new ERT members.

Training & Development Committee

This committee reports to the Club Vice President.

Those who volunteer need to be able to facilitate training sessions and must be on the Emergency Response Team (ERT). Some knowledge of content development and the use of PowerPoint is preferred.

Emergency Response Training – Four-part series of 1-hour sessions

In-person or via ZOOM. Tentative dates for classes are:

- Session times: 9 AM, 11 AM and 1 PM
- April 15, April 22, April 29, May 6 (May 13 and May 30 make-ups)

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We are still looking for a Chairperson for the Training & Development Committee. If you have experience in corporate training or were an educator, this position could be the one for you. If you would like to find out more about this opportunity, please contact me.

Additionally, we are going to hold training classes for all members who are, or wish to become, members of the Emergency Response Team (ERT). Hopefully, we will be able to hold these classes in person. If not, we will offer them via ZOOM. There will be a series of 4-classes, and each class is approximately 1-hour. Members of the ERT must complete all four sessions as well as the Red Cross First Aid course for Adults. Did you know that Red Cross First Aid courses are the only courses that the State of California recognizes under the Good Samaritan Law! The Red Cross course is \$35, and the club will reimburse you if you become an ERT member.

Establish a Neighborhood Plan:

Street Captain and Co-captain Program to cover every street in OHCC

- THE ROLE of captains and co-captains is to reach out to each OHCC household, collecting the Neighbor Helping Neighbor form, when possible, from people willing to participate
- Explain and encourage use of the "OK/HELP" Red/Green Sign and the "Vial of Life"
- Identify those who may need help in an emergency (e.g. loss of power, fire, earthquake) and link them with a neighbor who is willing to assist
- Encourage residents to prepare and be ready for various disasters
- **Promote a friendly and caring atmosphere** on the street by encouraging random acts of kindness among the neighbors
- Be an ambassador for SERT by explaining its mission and encouraging membership in the club, help with publicizing SERT events. When permitted, help organize social events for their street.


