## Response

- When a disaster or major emergency occurs or upon telephone or radio alert:
- Care for self and family first
- Report to your staging area
- While enroute to staging area, assist neighbors and make damage assessments
- ERN operators should report their status to Team Leaders. Team Leaders pass this information on to the Command Post


## **Communicate Damage**

- You must communicate your findings to Team Leader who transmits this information to the Command Post
- This information can be transmitted via ERN radio or in writing. In either case, OHCC Damage Assessment Forms shall be used for documentation.
- Locations around buildings shall be described using the ABCD standard, with A side corresponding to the front of the structure and B, C, and D representing the sides of the building moving clockwise from A

## ASSESSING DAMAGE

- Assess building from all sides
- Determine level of damage according to following chart
- If building is creaking or "groaning", do not enter
- Listen and smell for gas leaks

Type of Damage	Characteristics
Light	<ul> <li>Superficial damage</li> <li>Broken windows</li> <li>Fallen or cracked plaster</li> <li>Minor damage to interior contents</li> </ul>
Moderate	<ul> <li>Visible signs of damage</li> <li>Decorative work that is damaged or has fallen</li> <li>Visible cracks in plaster</li> <li>Major damage to interior contents</li> </ul>
Heavy	<ul> <li>Partial or total collapse or tiliting</li> <li>Obvious structural instability</li> <li>Heavy smoke or fire, known hazards materials (e.g., gas leaks), or rising or moving water</li> </ul>



## The nine steps involved in sizeup are:

- 1. Gather facts
- 2. Assess and communicate the damage
- 3. Consider probabilities
- 4. Assess your own situation
- 5. Establish priorities
- 6. Make decisions
- 7. Develop plans of action
- 8. Take action
- 9. Evaluate progress
